
RECEPTION



Reception class have particularly loved technology this week and we have enjoyed exploring our new interactive board. We have enhanced our learning of patterns and pairs by playing cool new games and have also loved making elaborate maps and drawings to extend and develop our superhero play. The class have thoroughly enjoyed Scraps Phonics and we are all amazed at how quickly they are learning to read and write phonetic words.



YEAR 1



This week we have used the great story 'Funnybones' in our English lessons. The children have worked hard throughout the week to write about their favourite part, to think of words to describe the skeletons, form sentences to re tell the story and then finally write their own sentences about different places the skeletons could visit. The ideas were great, from playing volleyball on the beach and ending up as a pile of bones, to eating in a restaurant and all the food falling out of the

skeleton! We kick started our 'fabric faces' DT project for this term by investigating different fabrics and some of us even had a go at the sewing part of the project. A great, fun-filled week. Well done Year 1.



YEAR 2



Year 2 have had a busy week! They have started learning about the story of the Good Samaritan and enjoyed acting it out in the classroom! In

English we have introduced the concept of vowels and consonants (not to be muddled with 'Continents!) and verbs and have had great fun playing 'Simon says'. In science, we have been looking at the life processes of living things and enjoyed comparing a Kindergarten doll with Mrs Kingman's real baby!



YEAR 3



Year 3 children had a busy week learning about the prehistoric era. They continued their journey through time with the "Stone Age boy" – the main character in the book we are reading at the moment. The children followed the boy into the forest and wrote their own setting descriptions, using beautiful figurative language. In Maths, the children worked on mastering their place value knowledge: they represented numbers to 1000 in different ways and enjoyed estimating numbers on a number line. Our history lesson saw children design an advert for a Stone Age shelter in the classroom and in science children learned about the process of fossilisation. An engaging and enjoyable week for everyone!






YEAR 4





Just look at our informative posters we have created in Science. We learned all about the dangers associated with electricity and have produced some posters to put around our school to help keep other children (and adults!) safe.



YEAR 5

This week, the children have been working hard with their larger numbers in our unit of place value. They have been working practically with number lines to calculate each interval (or jump!) before using this information to find missing numbers. They worked extremely well with their partner and explained this challenging concept very well.

In English, the children have been looking in detail at fact files. Linking with our class text (Into the Volcano!) they researched many facts about USA before using

this information to create their own fact file. Like

last week, they have learnt lots of exciting new vocabulary to engage the reader and their understanding of these has been impressive!

In curriculum lessons, we have been learning all about tectonic plates and where these are located across the world. They have used their knowledge of continents and countries to help with this and we have even talked about The Ring of Fire!



YEAR 6



Year 6 have been learning all about Light in their Science topic this term. They have been exploring how light travels, how our eyes work and how we are able to see objects. The children worked hard in teams to prove the theory that light travels in straight lines by lining up pieces of card, each with a small hole in the centre, and seeing if light only reached the final card when the holes were aligned. Next week, they will look at reflection and investigate how periscopes can help us to see around corners.

In our English lessons, the class have been exploring poetry from other cultures and finding examples of figurative language. They have been creating their own fabulous descriptions based on aspects of India and are now putting their poetry skills into action to create a sensory poem. They have been thinking carefully about their vocabulary and have used imagery to create a vivid picture in the mind of the reader.

It has been a busy week and all the children have risen to the challenges set and have continued to be excellent role models as prefects and infant helpers.

THE START OF THE SCHOOL DAY
