#### **KINDERGARTEN**



In kindergarten we have been looking at our homes this week. We've been talking about our houses in 'show and tell' and we've used some great cutting and sticking skills to create our own box house too. We talked about the details we could see; how many doors and windows, plants in the garden, cars parked on the drive, and where we thought our bedroom was.

This week we have had a block of lessons of geography with lots of great activities, discussions and work. We have looked at the different kinds of buildings in our local area and the children were great at recognising the local BP garage, museum, church and restaurant as well as explaining the purpose of each building. We then went on to look at different types of homes and I was so interested when the children gave their reasons for choosing



the type of home they would like to live in. We had caravans because they can move around, semi-detached houses because they are close to someone, flats because they can go up high and cottages because they are old. What great knowledge the children had! We now are looking forward to going out for a walk in the local area next week to apply all of this great geographical knowledge that we have gained. ### YEAR 2



Year 2 were lucky enough to have a visit from Mrs Kingman and baby Rosa last Friday. They asked some great questions and found out a lot about the care and development of babies. We have been learning a lot about the features of instruction writing, following instructions to make jam sandwiches and writing our own to make Marvellous Medicines.







#### YEAR 3



In English, Year 3 have been studying instruction texts and have written a set of instructions on how to make Stone Age weapons and clothes. In History, the children travelled through time from Stone age to Bronze Age and Iron Age. They started learning about the Celts and their way of life. Year 3 children discovered that the Celts loved swirly patterns and designed their own "clever Celtic knots"! PSHEE has seen the children write well-structured speeches for the School Council election.

Everyone in Year 3 couldn't wait to reveal the fossils they created in Science last week. The children know that fossil formation takes thousands of years but they thoroughly enjoyed speeding up the natural process to create their own fossils of dinosaurs and shells.





YEAR 4





In English this week, we have been learning all about figurative language and expanded noun phrases. The children have been working hard to produce rich vocabulary that they can use next week in our narrative writing, which is our end goal.





#### YEAR 5










Children also took on the role of 'experts' where they supported their peers in a range of key skills. In curriculum, the children have been learning about what it takes to be a responsible citizen and what rights children have. We can all make a difference in society and the children participated in some lovely discussions.

This week, the children have been working hard with their rounding skills in maths. They have been using their knowledge of place value to help with this, as well as looking at certain digits within the numbers. In pairs, they created giant number lines using tape before adding their own scales accurately for precise measures! In English, they have completed their Big Write focussing on a Fact File. They have been working hard on their editing skills, by reading their writing out loud, and they even managed to find places around the school for extra focus! This enabled them to identify where the missing punctuation went.



#### YEAR 6

In Science, we have been investigating light, and this week, the children learnt about reflection. They looked at the incident ray and the reflected ray and created periscopes to show how mirrors can be used to help us see around obstacles. The children really enjoyed creating their periscopes and trying them out – they were also able to write an explanation of how they enable us to see around corners.





In Art this week, the children have been continuing with their topic of India and have been exploring Mehndi patterns. They have created their own designs and have shown careful attention to detail when making their patterns. They will now be on display in our classroom.







In Maths, the children have been learning about factors and multiples and have been investigating factor bugs to help identify prime and square numbers. They have been using their multiplication skills to solve challenging questions as well as designing their own investigations and drawing conclusions from their results. Well done, Year 6 – keep practising those Rockstar tables as they are the key to so many areas of the maths curriculum!

#### **REMINDERS:**

#### THE START OF THE SCHOOL DAY

Registers are taken at 9.00am each day and it is very helpful if the children can be in school in good time for this. Lessons start promptly after registration and it can be very unsettling for children who arrive late and are not ready to start lessons with their friends.

We do understand that sometimes arriving late is unavoidable due to traffic problems etc. and on these occasions, children should be brought to the main front door to enter school. Your support in helping us to ensure a smooth start to the day for the children is very much appreciated.

#### THE FRONT OF SCHOOL

Now that the wall repairs have been completed, we are keen to get the grass area at the front of the school back to a good condition. Could we ask please that children do not run or play on the grass at the end of the school day and walk around it when going to meet their parents. At this time of year, when the weather is often wet, the grass quickly becomes churned up and muddy and this does not look particularly pleasant outside the building. Teachers will remind the children of this rule and we thank you for your support in keeping everyone off the grass.

#### KIDS CLUB IS AVAILABLE EVERYDAY

Do remember that our Kids Club wrap around care is available from 7.45am to 6pm every day. If you are a regular user of Kids Club, please contact the school office to arrange for a fob to allow you to enter the side green gates. Could we please remind everyone using Kids Club that it is very important that the gates are closed properly and securely on entry/exit to keep the children safe.
