




## YEAR 1

Year 3 children have enjoyed a fun and engaging end to their first half term in Year 3! The children continued learning about the fascinating Celtic people. They learned that the Celts loved brightly coloured clothes and decided to weave their own multicoloured cloaks. Year 3 children are not the only ones hard at work in the classroom! Our little superheroes – the worms – are busy turning scraps of food from Mrs Woodrow's cooking sessions into compost. The children love observing how their mini compost bins are working.

This week, we painted our Egyptian death masks in Art. We can't wait for them to dry so we can try them on!

In Science this term, we have focused on electricity. We have made safety posters, learned how to build simple circuits, and this week, we got the juices flowing in a variety of fruits and potatoes to see whether we could get a bulb to light up using a piece of fruit as a battery cell. What fabulous teamwork the children displayed!



# YEAR 5



In maths this week, the children have been consolidating their knowledge of rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000. We have also been taking part in a range of practical investigations involving place value and mental calculations. They were involved in some fantastic thought-provoking discussions and worked extremely well with their partners.

In English, the children have been drafting their nonchronological reports on a volcano. They have used



their learning from geography lessons to support this, including technical vocabulary and a range of openers and conjunctions for cohesion. We have also been checking our work thoroughly by reading them out loud to each other, and with our partners.

In curriculum, the children have incorporated technology into their art lessons! Inspired by Andy Warhol, they edited their portraits using his techniques, and their creativity here is amazing! Well done everyone!













On Friday, the Year 6 children learnt about Hindu ceremonies and made a friendship bracelet during Forest School. They used knotting and plaiting techniques to create colourful bands which they then presented to a friend. They used their knowledge of Mehndi artwork to create a clay hand and used found materials to create indentations in the clay to show the intricate patterns of this art form. All really enjoyed learning more about Indian culture and are now really excited with the prospect of making a 'Forest School' vegetable curry on Friday. Let's hope it is as delicious as the chai tea!

In Science this week, the children have been learning about Isaac Newton and the colour spectrum. They looked at how light travels through a prism and splits into the different colours and made

colour wheels to observe how light appears white.

In English lessons, the children have been creating their own characters for their 'Indian Tales' and have been developing their use of speech to advance the action in a story.

All have worked really hard this term and should be really proud of all that they have achieved.

Eco club have been amazing at harvesting and maintaining our school garden this term. After harvesting the last of our potatoes, they have set onions and garlic to be overwintered.




