KINDERGARTEN



We really enjoyed making witches potions in our last Forest School session and mixing them with big sticks. It was also nice to get outside when we earned 5 pom-poms for good team work. We noticed that our shadows were really long and we drew some of them using chalk.





RECEPTION



This has been a really interesting maths week. We have investigated the number 6 and worked out lots of different ways to make 6. We noticed lots of different patterns 3+3, 4+2, 5+1, 2+2+2 and made them in a variety of ways. We talked about curved and straight shapes and had fun sorting and organising them too. At the end of the week we have enjoyed writing a letter to Santa which we will be posting at Bookmark on Monday next week.









YEAR 1

Year 1 have been travelling out to sea this week! We read the story 'Class 3 all at Sea' and then used this as a basis for our own adventure story where we travel out to sea and meet some pirates. The children had some great thoughts about how we could be rescued and enjoyed sharing their ideas in our group planning sessions. They then went on to plan and write their own stories in our extended writing session and produced some really great work. In science this week, we transformed into weather reporters and enjoyed being filmed delivering the weather using the terms north, south, east and west to explain the different weather around the UK. Another busy week Year 1, well done for all your hard work.







YEAR 2

Year 2 have had fun with 2D and 3D shapes this week, counting sides and vertices and learning a bit of Greek whilst we were at it! The children enjoyed making as many shapes as they could using 15 lollipop sticks.





We have written some excellent non-fiction reports on the dodo and endangered species such as orangutans and polar bears, considering environmental threats to them. We have been busy making Christmas decorations and rehearsing our play too!

YEAR 3

Year 3 children have been busy writing and illustrating their spooky stories this week. The children loved working on creating tension and suspense in their stories. Mrs Periam and Miss Meachen are most impressed with the powerful descriptive vocabulary that was used. We cannot wait to listen to this excellent selection of spine-chilling thrillers! Our Design and Technology project for this term is well and truly underway: the children are working on their beautiful Christmas inspired appliques which they will be taking home at the end of the term as a present for their families. The children are putting a lot of effort into their intricate designs and are extremely proud of their work! Our Science lesson this week has seen the children experiment with magnetism and magnetic fields by testing various materials around the classroom. A busy and fun week of learning!









In art, Year 4 have made Christmas tree decorations from natural resources. We collected sticks, dried them, cut them to size and glued them into the shape of trees. Next, we chose our wool and wrapped it around the frame and decorated them with recycled buttons and glitzy gems.

We were super proud of the outcome and walked our decorations to the Methodist Church, Broad Street, where we decorated a tree ready for their Christmas craft day on Saturday.

In Maths, we have been times table investigators - digging deep to find patterns, tips and tricks to recall our times tables. We are getting very good at knowing the fact families, division facts and inverse operations.

In English, we are enjoying our Krindlekrax class reader, but we feel so very sorry for Ruskin Splinter, all he wants is to be the hero in the school play. We are working hard to learn lots of persuasive techniques and are busy writing the most persuasive letter to Mr Lace to change his mind! Watch out next week for the finished pieces!





YEAR 5

In Maths this week, the children have been taking on the challenge of fractions. They have learnt how to convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers, as well as using their multiplication facts to find their equivalent forms. To support their learning, the children have been using cubes and drawing pictures, and this helps with their understanding of this challenging concept. Their next step was to answer a range of reasoning questions, proving, and disproving theories. Brains were certainly worked hard in these parts of the lessons!



In curriculum, the children have been busy making their decorations for Christmas. They used a variety of Christmas materials to complete their final product, and these will be revealed soon! The children have also been learning all about irreversible changes in science lessons. They mixed vinegar and bicarbonate of soda to produce a gas, before mixing warm milk with vinegar to create a surprise material! Their scientific discussions were amazing and we learnt how these products cannot revert back to their original form.

YEAR 6

In English lessons this week, the children have been developing their writing skills and have created fabulous 'Winter Wonderland' descriptive prose. They have really impressed with their superb vocabulary, excellent use of openers and have even tried to include the subjunctive form! They should be really proud of their expertly written final pieces.



In our Science lessons, the children have been looking at the reliability of their results and have been repeating experiments to ensure their accuracy. They showed excellent questioning and inquiry skills and were able to give evidence to support their conclusions. Excellent science skills, Year 6!

In Art this week, the children have been busy making Christmas decorations. They used precise painting skills to create wooden

decorations to hang on the tree. They are looking forward to completing the finishing touches and hanging them on our school tree next week.

On Thursday, Year 6 had a fantastic time at 'Christmas Unwrapped' at the Baptist Church in Spalding. They really enjoyed decorating biscuits, finding out about the Christmas story, singing raps and answering quiz questions. A big thank you to all the organisers at the Baptist Church for making us feel so welcome.
