

KINDERGARTEN

This week in Kindergarten, we started using Drawing Club to help us bring the stories we read to life. From Monday, when we opened our first club, we discovered that our youngest school members have weird and wonderful imaginations! From lions losing their manes in the wind, to magical moving cakes, while in drawing club, the children are immersed in a magical world of their own creating. We are learning new vocabulary, writing secret codes using letters and numerals and taking the characters in the stories we read on new adventures.



RECEPTION

This week we have enjoyed the traditional tale Little Red Riding Hood. The children have joined Drawing Club and are happily inventing and creating characters, settings and storylines as well as adding secret code words and sentences.

Maths has focused on the numbers 6, 7 and 8 this week and we have loved representing the numbers using tens frames, Numicon and number sentences. Our number knowledge and reasoning are developing wonderfully.







YEAR 1

This week the Year 1 children have been working on understanding the differences between fiction and non-fiction books and learning the features of both types of books. They went on to produce their own non-fiction piece of writing, all about the planet Mars. We have picked up on our history work from last week and have been investigating lots of facts about Neil Armstrong. The children loved using their 'true' and 'false' paddles to show what they had learnt about his life. It was interesting to hear their thoughts when they were asked to share their ideas about why Neil Armstrong wanted to go to space in the first place! We have finished off another great week in school with an amazing class assembly all about... yes, you've guessed it... space! Well done Year 1, Miss Webster and Mrs Jeffries are very proud of you all for a great assembly today.







Year 2 have been busy with their new text, 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', looking at font style and size and how it can be used to make the story more interesting. We have also taken the opportunity to talk about homophones. In History, we have started learning about the story of Eyam and how it used quarantine and social distancing to prevent the spread of the Plague. We have completed and delivered our presentations on habitats and learnt some very interesting facts in the process.



YEAR 3



Year 3 children have worked hard this week and approached every task with enthusiasm. In English they planned, wrote and edited a persuasive letter trying to convince their friends and family members to join the Roman Army. They wrote eloquent letters and put forward excellent persuasive arguments. The theme of the Roman Army and the soldier's life continued into our Art lessons, with the children designing their own Roman shields.





They learned about the battle tactics used in Ancient Rome and practised marching in testudo formations. They have shown themselves to be well disciplined and attentive soldiers. What an engaged and enthusiastic group of children!



YEAR 4



Year 4 have had a very busy week, but as always have risen to the challenges we have faced! In Maths, the children have been using their division facts to build on their knowledge of dividing a 2-digit or 3-digit number by a 1-digit number. We used our base ten equipment and place value charts to explore the sharing structure of division. We moved on to calculations where an exchange was needed between the tens and the ones. Some tricky learning this week – well done Year 4!

YEAR 5



This week in Maths, the children have been completing the unit of division with a focus on remainders and reasoning. The children have completed a range of reasoning questions, including missing number problems, to apply their knowledge further.

In English, the children have been completing their biography based on an inspirational person. They have carried out their own research, drafted and edited their work both independently and with their peers. The class have been enthusiastic with the editing process, showing a great understanding of the need to revisit and improve their work.

In curriculum, the children have been learning about the 10 Gurus in RE and how they influenced Sikhism. They were given the task to find information hidden around the room, making notes on certain qualities they each have. The children enjoyed the activity and showed great investigative skills.



YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 have been working hard on their topic Poles Apart and have learnt about the climate of the poles. They have been using their maths skills to create line graphs and climate graphs and have even managed to use excel to graph their data. They have thought carefully about the scale they need to use,



accurately plotted the data, and have used their results to draw conclusions as to the climate of this harsh environment. They really enjoyed visiting Kindergarten to talk about penguins and polar bears.



Our Art lessons have seen our plastic bottles transform into the shape of penguins and some of the



children have been starting to add layers of Modroc to harden the exterior – hopefully our plastic bottles will soon turn into a fully-fledged waddle!

In Maths lessons, the children have shown determination and perseverance with the challenging concept of algebra. They have been learning about how to use 2-step function machines and form

expressions. They have been keen to learn about algebraic equations and are looking forward to continuing their learning next week.

In English lessons, the children have been learning about semi-colons and how to include them in lists and have been creating their own 'Adaptation Raps' as part of our work on performance poetry. We will look at how to develop our performance skills next week.
