YEAR 2

Tuesday 30th January



We acted out our own story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears.







This week Year 2 have had great fun acting out their own sequels to Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We have started to look at an alternative version, 'Me and You' by Anthony Browne, set in an inner city, and considering the reasons that he set out the text as he did. In History we have been studying the Bill of Mortality and other evidence for the plague in Eyam. Our minibeast hunt during Forest School was marginally less successful, but we had great fun anyway examining what we now understand to be 'Microhabitats'!



What a fun, exciting week! English lessons this week were tightly linked with our Year 3 History topic: Ancient Romans. Year 3 have started working on the new genre of news report. The children learned about the City of Pompeii and the eruption of Vesuvius. They have learned how to ask engaging questions and transformed themselves into reporters, interviewing their classmates, Mrs Periam and Miss Meachen.

In Art, the children started working on their

new project, Roman villas. The children are enjoying decorating the courtyards of their villas with fountains and mosaics. Some villas even come with farmland, complete with sheep and cows! What an imaginative group of children!

During History lessons, Year 3 children researched information about Roman theatres, gladiators, Roman baths and chariot racing and presented their findings to their classmates in the shape of impressive posters, videos and PowerPoints. All children held themselves confidently and researched the subject thoroughly. Mrs Periam and Miss Meachen are incredibly proud of them and would like to thank the parents for their support and encouragement!






YEAR 4

SCIENCE: Does the size of the pinnae affect the volume of a sound?

Today, the children planned an investigation to answer the question – does the size of the pinnae affect the volume of a sound? They worked in groups to plan their investigations to ensure it was a fair test. Next, they tested each pinnae and recorded their results.



In English, the children were introduced to an epic poem. We discovered that 'epic' means a very long poem about heroes and warriors. Beowulf is one of the first recorded stories we have in Britian, and it was written in old English. The story of Beowulf, first told around 800AD, tells of events around 200 years before that! It wasn't written down back then. Instead, the story was passed down orally by storytellers.



We watched short films of Beowulf and worked in groups to orally retell the key events. Next, we decided on 10 key events and created a timeline to help us remember the sequence. The children were given the opportunity to choose a character and draw their own interpretation based on their individual beliefs and recall of the story. They ended the lesson by generating descriptive language to support their imaginative artistic work!







YEAR 5

In Maths this week, the children have been introduced to the concept of multiplying fractions by not only other fractions, but also by whole numbers. They showed great understanding as to what fractions of amounts mean and have used their knowledge of times tables to help find these at pace. The class also drew pictures to show their understanding, before completing a range of challenging reasoning questions to stretch them further.

In English, the children have been drafting their short sci-fi narrative based on the Pixar animation: Lifted. They recapped the elements of a story mountain and analysed another narrative. This enabled them to identify which elements belong where in different stories, as well as their purpose. The children have been experimenting with characterisation and speech to advance the action based on this clip, before using this to help in their own narrative.



In Science, the class took their learning outdoors and created the solar system to scale. They used accurate measurements and learnt the distance between the planets, their orbit paths and how the distance impacts on their time to orbit the sun. We even used real fruits (to scale!) and placed them on our solar system.



In Art, the famous Vincent Van Gogh was introduced, and the children are now at the stage where they are producing their own Starry Night. We look forward to showing you the masterpieces next week!

YEAR 6

This week, the Year 6 children really enjoyed their forest school session, where they were learning all about adaptation and evolution to support their science topic. They created their own creatures and even looked at ways that they might adapt further in the future. They have been writing about their creation's incredible adaptations as part of their science lesson.

In PHSEE lessons, the class have been looking at 'Dreams and Goals' and this week they have been thinking about their dreams for the world and hopes for the future. They created a class banner for the classroom, showcasing their fabulous ideas, and have thought of ways that they can help to bring about change.



In English, we have been looking at performance poetry. We have watched some fabulous poets performing and have used this to help us perform our adaptation raps. The children are really looking forward to presenting them to the class.



Our penguins are now all ready for mod-roc, as the children have carefully created the form for their sculpture and have transformed their simple bottle into their penguin structures. We cannot wait to paint them. Well done, Year 6 – another busy week!
